Welcome Confirmation Candidate,

We hope that you will choose to continue your faith journey by preparing to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation. While all the Sacraments are signs of God's presence in our lives and confer God's grace, Confirmation is a special Sacrament because it is a *public statement of faith* by you that you ready, willing and able to take on the rights and responsibilities of a fully initiated adult member of the Catholic Church. In receiving the Sacrament of Confirmation, you consciously affirm the promises made on your behalf by your Godparents in Baptism. You declare that you will be a witness to the Gospel in your words and deeds.

You cannot be compelled to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation. It is your choice. God is with you always and wants you to have a relationship with Him, but you choose whether to pursue that relationship ~ only you can decide to make the commitment to lifelong discipleship with Christ.

If you decide to pursue a deeper relationship with God through the Sacrament of Confirmation, you will need to prepare. As with any commitment, the preparation process will require effort, focus and, most of all, inspiration. Without inspiration, you may lose focus and your effort may wane. This Confirmation Portfolio is designed to help you understand the basic tenets of the faith you profess to believe and guide you in practicing your faith. You will practice your faith by attending weekly Sunday Mass, Spirit Masses, the Easter Triduum, Eucharistic Adoration and a spiritual retreat. You will also engage in various community service endeavors but you will not be alone on this journey. You will choose a sponsor, who along with your Parish priests, family, catechists, teachers and fellow parishioners can help you in your faith journey.

Now and throughout your journey, you should ask questions and make sure you understand the faith you are embracing to the best of your ability. You should search your heart and ask yourself over and over again if, in good conscience, you are ready to receive this Sacrament.

If you complete the preparation process and believe you are ready to make a lifelong commitment to Christ, his Excellency Bishop Dennis J. Sullivan, Ordinary of the Diocese of Camden, will confer the Sacrament of Confirmation upon you in the Spring. In this Sacrament, you will receive God's grace to help you fulfill your lifelong commitment to Him.

We pray that you will find your own way to becoming an adult disciple of Christ.

- What do I hope to discover in the preparation process? What are my goals in the process? Are they realistic? How can I ensure that I can achieve my goals.
- How do I feel about being Confirmed? Why do my parents want me to be confirmed?
- What talents do I have that I can share with others? What service activities can I do? Is there someone in the Parish with whom I can speak about service ministries or who can guide me?
- Whom should I ask to be my Sponsor?
- What passages in the Bible do I want to read and understand?
- Have I changed since I started preparing for my Confirmation?

# CHOOSING A SPONSOR

Canon #874 of Church law states that a Sponsor must be:

- At least 16 years of age
- A confirmed Catholic
- Who is living according to the Catholic Faith.

There is no regulation that provides men must sponsor boys or women must sponsor girls.

# PRECEPTS OF THE CHURCH

Guidelines for Catholics

The Precepts of the Catholic Church are a description of the absolute minimum actions required of Catholics regarding the Church.

The Church uses these precepts to remind us that a Christian life requires a commitment to prayer and active participation in the liturgy and sacraments. If we fall below this bare-minimum level, we can't rightly consider ourselves to be in full communion with the Catholic Church.

- 1. You should participate in the Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation.
- 2. You should do penance on the appointed days especially by abstaining from meat and fasting.
- 3. You should receive the Sacrament of Penance.
- 4. You should receive Holy Communion frequently.
- 5. You should contribute to the support of the Church; including your parish and other causes.
- 6. You should observe the laws of the Church concerning marriage.

# CHOOSING A SAINT'S NAME Saint Report

Confirmation includes a naming ritual. In taking a Confirmation name, you are asking God to change you; to establish your relationship with Him as a mature adult and to give you strength to live your faith more fully. You might wish to keep your Baptismal name because you began your journey with Christ with that name and it expresses the relationship that exists between the two Sacraments of Baptism and Confirmation. Instead, you might choose a new name to remind you that your choice to be a disciple of Christ is a life altering decision. In the Scriptures, there are a number of times when a person changes his name to reflect a change of life. For instance, Jesus told Peter that his new name was Simon when he assumed a role of leadership in the Church (Matthew 16:18), and when God made His first covenant with Abraham, He changed Abraham's name to Abram and Sarah's name to Sara because their new names showed their change in life as God's chosen people (Genesis 17).

You should choose a name only after considerable research about a Saint because you are asking this Saint to be your friend and advocate for the rest of your life. The Saint's life should have special meaning to you and serve as a guide for your own life. Some Saints are associated with special needs or places. For instance, if you love animals, you might choose St. Francis, if you are an athlete, you might choose St. Sebastian, if you have knee problems, St. Roch, or if your family is from South America, you might choose St. Rose of Lima, the patroness of South America. If you decide to keep your Baptismal name, you will need to choose your patron. There are a number of St. Johns and more than one St. Katherine or St. Elizabeth. Who will be the person you will try to imitate as you follow Christ? You need not choose a person of your same gender.

My Catholic Faith

#### Body of Letter

Paragraph One: Introduce yourself to the Bishop and tell him something about your family, your history, etc.

- **Paragraph Two:** Request that the Bishop confer the Sacrament of Confirmation on you and provide reasons why you would like to be confirmed.
- **Paragraph Three:** Explain how you have prepared for the Sacrament including specific information about your prayer life, celebration of other sacraments, your service for others, etc.
- **Paragraph Four:** Tell the Bishop how you plan to carry out your life of service to God and others through the power of the Holy Spirit and how you plan to make Confirmation in faith real and alive in the future.

#### Conclusion

Conclude the letter and write your complete signature.

## HOLY TRIDUUM REFLECTIONS



Holy Week is the most solemn and glorious week in Christianity because it commemorates the final week of Our Lord's life. Sundown on Holy Thursday to sundown on Easter Sunday is considered the most solemn part of the liturgical year. This three-day period is referred to as the Holy Triduum.

On the evening of Holy Thursday, the Church relives *The Mass of the Lord's Supper*. After the homily the priest washes the feet of others (as Jesus did) to signify his role as a servant.

The ceremony on Good Friday is not a mass, but rather a communion service using the consecrated hosts from Holy Thursday. It often takes place at 3pm, the hour that Jesus took his last breath on the cross. Veneration of the cross takes place at this service where parishioners kneel before the cross and either touch or kiss it.

A vigil Mass is held after nightfall on Holy Saturday, or before dawn on Easter Sunday, in celebration of the resurrection of Jesus. This is called the Easter Vigil, the most glorious, beautiful and dramatic liturgy for the Church.
