### ***Saints Philip and James, May 3***

*James, Son of Alphaeus:* We know nothing of this man except his name, and, of course, the fact that Jesus chose him to be one of the 12 pillars of the New Israel, his Church. He is not the James of Acts, son of Clopas, “brother” of Jesus and later bishop of Jerusalem and the traditional author of the Letter of James. James, son of Alphaeus, is also known as James the Lesser to avoid confusing him with James the son of Zebedee, also an apostle and known as James the Greater.



*Philip:* Philip came from the same town as Peter and Andrew, Bethsaida in Galilee. Jesus called him directly, whereupon he sought out Nathanael and told him of the “one about whom Moses wrote” (Jn 1:45).

Like the other apostles, Philip took a long time coming to realize who Jesus was. On one occasion, when Jesus saw the great multitude following him and wanted to give them food, he asked Philip where they should buy bread for the people to eat. Saint John comments, “[Jesus] said this to test him, because he himself knew what he was going to do” (Jn 6:6). Philip answered, “Two hundred days’ wages worth of food would not be enough for each of them to have a little [bit]” (Jn 6:7).

John’s story is not a put-down of Philip. It was simply necessary for these men who were to be the foundation stones of the Church to see the clear distinction between humanity’s total helplessness apart from God and the human ability to be a bearer of divine power by God’s gift.

On another occasion, we can almost hear the exasperation in Jesus’s voice. After Thomas had complained that they did not know where Jesus was going, Jesus said, “I am the way ... If you know me, then you will also know my Father...

# Dear Padre

***Why is the Church considering a word change to the Our Father? It seems fine as it is.***

Of the two versions of the Lord’s Prayer in Luke 11:2–4 and Matthew 6:9–13, Luke’s is more concise. The petition, “and lead us not into temptation” in Greek means both “do not allow us to enter into temptation” and “do not let us yield to temptation” (*Catechism of the Catholic Church*, 2846). The *Catechism* includes the explanation from James 1:13: “God cannot be tempted by evil and he himself tempts no one,” to certify that God “wants to set us free from evil. We ask him not to allow us to take the way that leads to sin.” Consequently, Pope Francis reportedly approved the English wording, “do not let us fall into temptation” to replace “lead us not into temptation.”

“It is not a good translation because it speaks of a God who induces temptation,” the Pope said in 2017. “I am the one who falls. It’s not him pushing me into temptation to then see how I have fallen.” On the contrary, “a father helps you to get up immediately,” he added. “It’s Satan who leads us into temptation—that’s his department.”

However, unlike the change in the Italian Lord’s Prayer that will appear in their third edition of *The Roman Missal*, no immediate plans have been made to change the wording in English-speaking countries.

## REGISTRATION REQUIRED

If you would like to attend one of these outdoor Vigil Masses, you **MUST REGISTER** by signing up online at the link above, or by calling the Parish Office at 914-725-2755 no later than the Friday before the scheduled Mass. Priority will be given to registered parishioners.

## FACE COVERINGS REQUIRED

Each attendee will be required to wear a face mask that covers his/her nose and mouth at all times.

## SEATING/AUTOMOBILE PARKING

The Altar will be at the front entrance to the Narthex under the glass canopy.

There will be a limited number of outdoor benches available for seating and other designated areas to set up your own chairs and/or blankets including the playground area, field, St. Francis circle, Fr. John's memorial seating area, and flagpole/cobblestone area in front of the church building. (You may wish to bring insect repellent and/or an umbrella for shade from the sun but please do not block anyone's view of the altar with your umbrella.)

Please note that we cannot sanitize the recreational equipment in the playground area so it would be best if your child does not use it in light of the pandemic. During Mass, the equipment will be off limits.

In order to comply with the social distancing mandates of New York State and the ADNY, our volunteer ushers will direct you to a seating area. There will be five (5) parking spots near the flagpole facing the Altar for attendees who would like to stay in their vehicles with engines off throughout the Mass. The benches and (5) parking spots **MUST BE RESERVED** in advance but please note that **PRIORITY** will be given to seniors and parishioners who are handicapped.

Our ushers will check your reservations when you arrive and, if you do not have a reservation, if there is room, they will direct you to a spot on the field.

If you have a fever, are ill or have been exposed recently to someone who is ill, please do not come to the Masses. Our first priority is the safety of everyone.

Offertory boxes will be set up around the property for you to make your donations to the parish.

Holy Communion will be distributed in various locations around the property. Please wait for our volunteer ushers to instruct you regarding the location for you to receive Communion. As you get into the line for Communion, please use the hand sanitizer provided and do not touch any surface including your face prior to receiving communion. As you approach the priest or Eucharistic Minister, do not remove your facial covering. Please extend your hand (without gloves) to receive the host and move six feet to the left or right before removing your facial covering to consume the host. After consuming the host, please replace your face covering and sanitize your hands at one of the sanitizing stations before returning to your assigned area.

If you wish to receive Communion in your car, please note that our Eucharistic Ministers will not approach your vehicle unless you are wearing a face mask that covers your nose and mouth.

## ARRIVAL/PARKING/DEPARTURE

Please enter via Mamaroneck Road and follow the directions of our volunteers as parking will be permitted in designated areas only and may be limited. Please exit via Secor Road but please do not exit the parking area until you are given a signal from a volunteer to exit.

## RESTROOM ACCESS

If you need to use the restroom, you will be able to access the church building restrooms through the school building. You will not be able to access the facilities from the Narthex.

## INCLEMENT WEATHER

In the event of inclement weather, the Mass will be held inside the main church building. If you are not comfortable attending Mass in the church building, you can stay in your car and listen to the Mass via the outside speakers. Distribution of communion will be held underneath the glass canopy during Communion of the Mass.

## ST. PIUS X GUIDELINES TO SAFELY ATTEND MASS

  - Do not attend Mass if in the last 14 days:
    - you have had any of the symptoms associated with contracting the COVID-19 Virus.
    - you have tested positive for COVID-19
    - you have been in close contact with someone with a confirmed or suspected COVID-19 case
  - If you have arrived from another state or country, you must comply with current regulations regarding quarantine/testing
  - In order to enforce CDC and State social distancing rules our capacity at the Church is limited.

- For weekend and holiday Masses, you will be assigned a seat by a greeter. We keep a record of names and seats, in case tracing becomes necessary
  - You should arrive 15 minutes before Mass begins.
  - If you are diagnosed with COVID-19 in the subsequent 7 days after attending mass, please notify us by calling the parish office at 914-725-2755. Strictly confidential.
  - If we receive a report that someone who has attended a Mass at the Parish was subsequently diagnosed with COVID-19, we will make all necessary communications. And we will conduct a thorough, deep, cleaning and disinfecting of the church per CDC guidelines
- Thank you very much for your understanding and cooperation until the COVID-19 pandemic is no longer a threat.
