

### St. Justin (d. 165) – June 1

Justin never ended his quest for religious truth even when he converted to Christianity after years of studying various pagan philosophies.



As a young man, he was principally attracted to the school of Plato.

However, he found that the Christian religion answered the great questions about life and existence better than the philosophers.

Upon his conversion he continued to wear the philosopher's mantle, and became the first Christian philosopher. He combined the Christian religion with the best elements in Greek philosophy. In his view, philosophy was a pedagogue of Christ, an educator that was to lead one to Christ.

Justin is known as an apologist, one who defends in writing the Christian religion against the attacks and misunderstandings of the pagans. Two of his so-called apologies have come down to us; they are addressed to the Roman emperor and to the Senate.

For his staunch adherence to the Christian religion, Justin was beheaded in Rome in 165.

### Comment:

As patron of philosophers, Justin may inspire us to use our natural powers (especially our power to know and understand) in the service of Christ and to build up the Christian life within us. Since we are prone to error, especially in reference to the deep questions concerning life and existence, we should also be willing to correct and check our natural thinking in light of religious truth. Thus we will be able to say with the learned saints of the Church: I believe in order to understand, and I understand in order to believe.

### REGISTRATION REQUIRED

If you would like to attend one of these outdoor Vigil Masses, you <u>MUST REGISTER</u> by signing up online at the link above, or by calling the Parish Office at 914-725-2755 no later than the Friday before the scheduled Mass. Priority will be given to registered parishioners.

### FACE COVERINGS REQUIRED

Each attendee will be required to wear a face mask that covers his/her nose and mouth at all times.

### SEATING/AUTOMOBILE PARKING

The Altar will be at the front entrance to the Narthex under the glass canopy.

There will a limited number of outdoor benches available for seating and other designated areas to set up your own chairs and/or blankets including the playground area, field, St. Francis circle, Fr. John's memorial seating area, and flagpole/cobblestone area in front of the church building. (You may wish to bring insect repellent and/or an umbrella for shade from the sun but please do not to block anyone's view of the altar with your umbrella.)

Please note that we cannot sanitize the recreational equipment in the playground area so it would be best if your child does not use it in light of the pandemic. During Mass, the equipment will be off limits.

In order to comply with the social distancing mandates of New York State and the ADNY, our volunteer ushers will direct you to a seating area. There will be five (5) parking spots near the flagpole facing the Altar for attendees who would like to stay in their vehicles with engines off throughout the Mass. The benches and (5) parking spots MUST BE RESERVED in advance but please note that PRIORITY will be given to seniors and parishioners who are handicapped.

Our ushers will check your reservations when you arrive and, if you do not have a reservation, if there is room, they will direct you to a spot on the field.

If you have a fever, are ill or have been exposed recently to someone who is ill, please do not come to the Masses. Our first priority is the safety of everyone.

Offertory boxes will be set up around the property for you to make your donations to the parish.

Holy Communion will be distributed in various locations around the property. Please wait for our volunteer ushers to instruct you regarding the location for you to receive Communion. As you get into the line for Communion, please use the hand sanitizer provided and do not touch any surface including your face prior to receiving communion. As you approach the priest or Eucharistic Minister, do not remove your facial covering. Please extend your hand (without gloves) to receive the host and move six feet to the left or right before removing your facial covering to consume the host. After consuming the host, please replace your face covering and sanitize your hands at one of the sanitizing stations before returning to your assigned area.

If you wish to receive Communion in your car, please note that our Eucharistic Ministers will not approach your vehicle unless you are wearing a face mask that covers your nose and mouth.

### ARRIVAL/PARKING/DEPARTURE

Please enter via Mamaroneck Road and follow the directions of our volunteers as parking will be permitted in designated areas only and may be limited. Please exit via Secor Road but please do not exit the parking area until you are given a signal from a volunteer to exit.

### **RESTROOM ACCESS**

If you need to use the restroom, you will be able to access the church building restrooms through the school building. You will not be able to access the facilities from the Narthex.

### **INCLEMENT WEATHER**

In the event of inclement weather, the Mass will be held inside the main church building. If you are not comfortable attending Mass in the church building, you can stay in your car and listen to the Mass via the outside speakers. Distribution of communion will be held underneath the glass canopy during Communion of the Mass.

### Amendments to the Constitution and By-Laws

Below are the proposed amendments to the St Pius Constitution and By-Laws.

### **Proposed amendments:**

Article II of The Constitution and By-Laws of the St. Pius X Parish Council is hereby amended in connection with eligibility to attend and speak at Council meetings and vote for Parish Council candidates with the following replacement language: "All persons over the age of sixteen, who are Catholic or attend mass at St. Pius X Church, are eligible to attend and speak at Parish Council meetings and may vote for Parish Council candidates. However, one must be registered as a member of the Parish to be eligible for election to the Parish Council and to hold office."

Article III, Section C, of The Constitution and By-Laws of the St. Pius X Parish Council is hereby amended to remove sections 4, 5 and 6, and replace section 4 with the following language: "In the event that an elected or appointed member of the Council resigns or ceases to be a member of the Council, the President shall fill the vacancy for the balance of the unexpired term."

Article III, Section D, of The Constitution and By-Laws of the St. Pius X Parish Council is hereby amended to **remove sections 3 and 4** as unnecessary in connection with liaisons to organizations.

Article IV, of The Constitution and By-Laws of the St. Pius X Parish Council is hereby amended to be renamed "Transition and Implementation" and to remove sections 1 and 2, and replace them with the following language: "This amended set of by-laws may be adopted through both online and in-person balloting and takes effect immediately if it receives most of the votes cast through online and in-person balloting. These amended by-laws also ratify

changes and procedures adopted in response to the Covid pandemic.

Article IV of The Constitution and By-Laws of the St. Pius X Parish Council is hereby amended to add to the first sentence in section 1 the phrase "one or more Vice President(s)" in the place of the words "Vice President"

Article VIII of The Constitution and By-Laws of the St. Pius X Parish Council is hereby amended to remove sections 1 through 5 and replace them with the following sections:

- "1. There shall be a Nominating Committee appointed by the President for recruiting candidates and conducting elections.
- Parish announcements in the month before the elections shall make clear that parishioners may nominate themselves for election by notifying the Nominating Committee of their interest in seeking election to the Council.
- 3. The election of the members of the Council shall be through online and in-person balloting in Early June as designated by the Parish Council. All online elections held prior to the adoption of these amended by-laws are hereby ratified and deemed fully valid for all purposes."

Article IX of The Constitution and By-Laws of the St. Pius X Parish Council is hereby amended to remove sections 1 and 2 and replace them with the following language:

- Proposed amendments to the by-laws may be made by the Council or by a petition from ten or more parishioners. Any such proposed amendments shall first be distributed online at least two weeks prior to the vote on them.
- Amendments to the by-laws may be adopted through both online and in-person balloting, through voting procedures set by the Parish Council, and will take effect immediately if the amendments receive a majority of the votes cast through online and in-person balloting.


