

Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul, June 29

Peter (d. 64?). ...Peter makes
[a] great confession of faith:
"You are the Messiah" (Mark
8:29b). It was one of the many
glorious moments in Peter's life,
beginning with the day he was
called from his nets along the Sea



The New Testament clearly shows Peter as the leader of the apostles, chosen by Jesus to have a special relationship with him. With James and John he was privileged to witness the Transfiguration ... and the agony in Gethsemane... He was sent with John to prepare for the last Passover before Jesus' death. His name is first on every list of apostles...

Paul (d. 64?). ...He had been the most pharisaic of Pharisees, the most legalistic of Mosaic lawyers. Now he suddenly appears to other Jews as a heretical welcomer of Gentiles, a traitor and apostate.

Paul's central conviction was simple and absolute: Only God can save humanity. No human effort—even the most scrupulous observance of law—can create a human good which we can bring to God as reparation for sin and payment for grace. To be saved from itself, from sin, from the devil, and from death, humanity must open itself completely to the saving power of Jesus ...

Reflection

We would probably go to confession to Peter sooner than to any of the other apostles. He is perhaps a more striking example of the simple fact of holiness. Jesus says to us as he said, in effect, to Peter: "It is not you who have chosen me, but I who have chosen you..." Paul's experience of the risen Jesus on the road to Damascus was the driving force that made him one of the most zealous, dynamic, and courageous ambassadors of Christ the Church has ever had...

Dear Padre

June 27, 2021

This week is the Solemnity of Sts. Peter and Paul. Why doesn't each have his own feast day?

They do. Saints Peter and Paul are united in a solemnity on June 29 to honor their martyrdom, but each has his own feast: the Chair of St. Peter (February 22) and the Conversion of St. Paul (January 25).

Peter's primacy is evident in the prominence given to him by the Gospel writers and in the position of authority entrusted to him in the infant Church. Jesus promised Peter that he alone would be the foundation stone, keeper of the keys, and head shepherd (see Matthew 16:18–19 and John 21:15–17). Peter also oversaw Judas Iscariot's replacement (see Acts of the Apostles 1:15–26).

Paul holds a position of honor for his transformation from Church persecutor to "a slave of Christ Jesus" (Romans 1:1).

Saint Augustine wrote that they share a solemnity because, even though they didn't suffer on the same day, they suffered as one. On different days of presumably the same year, 67, Peter was crucified and Paul beheaded.

Their esteem coupled them in the early Church's devotion. Hence, the solemnity Mass preface states that "each in a different way gathered together the one family of Christ; and revered together throughout the world, they share one Martyr's crown."

FACE COVERINGS REQUIRED

Each attendee will be required to wear a face mask that covers his/her nose and mouth at all times.

SEATING/AUTOMOBILE PARKING

The Altar will be at the front entrance to the Narthex under the glass canopy.

There will a limited number of outdoor benches available for seating and other designated areas to set up your own chairs and/or blankets. (You may bring insect repellent and/or an umbrella for shade, but please do not to block anyone's view of the altar with your umbrella.)

Please note that we cannot sanitize the recreational equipment in the playground. During Mass, the playground is off limits.

In order to comply with the social distancing mandates of New York State and the ADNY, our volunteer ushers will direct you to a seating area. There will be five (5) parking spots near the flagpole facing the Altar for attendees who would like to stay in their vehicles with engines off throughout the Mass. The benches and (5) parking spots MUST BE RESERVED in advance but please note that PRIORITY will be given to seniors and parishioners who are handicapped.

Our ushers will check your reservations when you arrive and, if you do not have a reservation, if there is room, they will direct you to a spot on the field.

If you have a fever, are ill or have been exposed recently to someone who is ill, please do not come to the Masses. Our first priority is the safety of everyone.

Offertory boxes will be set up around the property for you to make your donations to the parish.

Holy Communion will be distributed in various locations around the property. Please wait for our volunteer ushers to instruct you regarding the location for you to receive Communion. As you get into the line for Communion, please use the hand sanitizer provided and do not touch any surface including your face prior to receiving communion. As you approach the priest or Eucharistic Minister, do not remove your facial covering. Please extend your hand (without gloves) to receive the host and move six feet to the left or right before removing your facial covering to consume the host. After consuming the host, please replace your face covering and sanitize your hands at one of the sanitizing stations before returning to your assigned area.

If you wish to receive Communion in your car, please note that our Eucharistic Ministers will not approach your vehicle unless you are wearing a face mask that covers your nose and mouth.

ARRIVAL/PARKING/DEPARTURE

Please enter via Mamaroneck Road and follow the directions of our volunteers as parking will be permitted in designated areas only and may be limited. Please exit via Secor Road but please do not exit the parking area until you are given a signal from a volunteer to exit.

RESTROOM ACCESS

If you need to use the restroom, you will be able to access the church building restrooms through the school building. You will not be able to access the facilities from the Narthex.

INCLEMENT WEATHER

In the event of inclement weather, the Mass will be held inside the main church building. If you are not comfortable attending Mass in the church building, you can stay in your car and listen to the Mass via the outside speakers. Distribution of communion will be held underneath the glass canopy during Communion of the Mass.

Alternatively, you may continue to view the Masses online at http://saintpiusxchurch.com. You will receive many graces by making a Spiritual Communion.

IN CASE OF A MEDICAL EMERGENCY DURING MASS, PLEASE CALL 911 FIRST, and signal a volunteer, who will assist you.



Important Announcement About Attending Mass – **UPDATE!**

Starting in July, as part of New York State's lifting most of the coronavirus restrictions, the Church of St. Pius X is also easing some of our safety protocols.

- We no longer need you to make reservations to attend Mass.
- Parishioners will once again be choosing their own seats as they arrive. We will be maintaining social distancing between family groups in the pews.
- We will still maintain every other pew roped off for additional social distancing

If you have come to enjoy a specific seat during the reservation time period, please arrive early for best opportunity to sit in your preferred seats.

We do ask that you still:

- Wear masks, covering nose and mouth at all times, except to consume the host.
- Keep 3 feet distance and avoid gathering.
- Sanitize your hands when entering the Church.
- For weekend and holiday Masses, please remain in your originally chosen seat. Please do not change seats during the service.
- You should arrive 15 minutes before Mass begins so that you can sit in your preferred seats.
- Per CDC guidelines, it is no longer necessary to sanitize
 personal space between Masses but we will continue to do
 a weekly cleaning of the church. The sanitizing materials
 will remain in the pews for any person who wishes to
 sanitize his/her personal space before sitting.
- Do not attend Mass if in the last 14 days:
 - you have had any of the symptoms associated with contracting the COVID-19 Virus.
 - you have tested positive for COVID-19.
 - you have been in close contact with someone with a confirmed or suspected COVID-19 case.

If you are diagnosed with COVID-19 in the subsequent 7 days after attending mass, please notify us by calling the parish office at 914-725-2755. Strictly confidential.

To quote a recent newspaper article,



June 27, 2021 Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time (B) Wis 1:13–15; 2:23–24; 2 Cor 8:7, 9, 13–15 Mk 5:21–43 or 5:21–24, 35b–43

We operate under two very different economic systems. On one hand, in society the measure to which we claim a right is determined by the character and extent of our earning power. On the other hand, what is described in St. Paul's admonition to the Corinthians is more like the way economics operates in a family. There, need rather than earning power determines the measure of what we might claim as our right.

Both systems are built on important, though sometimes different, values. The prominent economic system in today's world advocates equality as the value upon which it is built. This includes equal pay for equal work, but also equality of opportunity. The system Paul advocates is built on issues of equity, which recognizes that all things are not equal. It insists that those who need more should get more. Both systems also face pitfalls. This could occur when a system based on equality does not operate on an "equal playing field." In such a situation, equality can lack justice. Then again, a system in which need or equity plays an important role must always be on the alert for idleness. Experience has shown that people have a tendency to take advantage of either system.

In an ideal system, both values operate. This is what Paul is actually advocating. He does not expect the rich to become poor. However, he does insist that as a matter of justice, and not charity, legitimate needs should be met. After all, we all are called to join the household of God.
