Saint Martin of Tours (c. 316 – November 8, 397), November 11

A conscientious objector who wanted to be a monk; a monk who was maneuvered into being a bishop; a bishop who fought paganism as well as pleaded for mercy to heretics—such was Martin of Tours, one of the most popular of saints and one of the first not to be a martyr.



Born of pagan parents in what is now Hungary, and raised in Italy, this son of a veteran was forced at the age of 15 to serve in the army. Martin became a Christian catechumen and was baptized when he was 18. It was said that he lived more like a monk than a soldier. At 23, he refused a war bonus and told his commander: “I have served you as a soldier; now let me serve Christ...” After great difficulties, he was discharged and went to be a disciple of Hilary of Poitiers.

He was ordained an exorcist and worked with great zeal against the Arians. Martin became a monk, living first at Milan and later on a small island. When Hilary was restored to his see following his exile, Martin returned to France and established what may have been the first French monastery near Poitiers. He lived there for 10 years, forming his disciples and preaching throughout the countryside.

The people of Tours demanded that he become their bishop. Martin was drawn to that city by a ruse—the need of a sick person—and was brought to the church, where he reluctantly allowed himself to be consecrated bishop ...

Along with Saint Ambrose, Martin rejected Bishop Ithacius's principle of putting heretics to death...

As death approached, Martin's followers begged him not to leave them. He prayed, “Lord, if your people still need me, I do not refuse the work. Your will be done.”

Dear Padre

November 7, 2021

My mother divorced, then remarried a non-Catholic. Her first marriage was never annulled. She says if she can't take Communion, there's no difference between watching Mass on TV and attending Mass in a church. I think there's a difference, and she should go to Mass in a church with other Catholics. Your thoughts?

It's a good sign that your mother is watching Mass on television instead of skipping Mass altogether, but you're right.

Television Masses are a viable option for Catholics who are physically unable to attend Mass, but if your mother is physically able, it's a different matter. When it comes to worship, there's nothing like being there, and by attending the liturgy with other Catholics every week and on holy days, she'll fulfill her obligation by virtue of baptism in “fully conscious and active participation” (Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy [*Sacrosanctum Concilium*], 14).

Keep encouraging your mom to attend weekly Mass in person and encourage her to contact her priest about starting annulment proceedings. If the annulment is granted and her current marriage is convalidated, she'll be able to receive the Eucharist.

Receiving Communion may be the privileged encounter with God, but Mass is primarily for worshiping and giving thanks to God. By returning to Mass with other Catholics now and eventually taking Communion, your mom's faith life clearly will be enriched.

They have more than 250 teachers-educators and volunteers, 400 youth leaders and 20,000 young people under their apostolic care. During the Covid19 pandemic, the Alagad ni Maria initiated “Hygiene Drive” to bring awareness to the importance of practicing good hygiene and distributed hand sanitizers and face masks to young people to avoid the spread of the virus. When Typhoon Vamco (Ulysses), the deadliest cyclone, hit the country in November 2020, where more than 180,000 people were evacuated, our community coordinated the distribution of relief goods to more than 10,000 families in the mission parishes in Quezon Province. The religious community of Fathers Sebastian and Raymond desperately need funds to continue and expand their ministries. The second collection this week is to support the missionary work of the Religious Institute of the Alagad ni Maria (Disciples of Mary). Please be generous.





Mask-optional 12 noon Mass, and ropes removed from some seating during 10:30am and 12 noon Masses

As a reminder, the Sunday 12pm mass has a mask-free side for those who are fully vaccinated (right hand as you enter the church, facing the statue of Our Blessed Mother). Furthermore, in order to better accommodate the increased participation at the Sunday 10:30am and 12pm Masses, the right hand side will also be without the pew cords. Notwithstanding, seated social distancing is also recommended.

Again, with the main intent to maintain safety, but striving to accommodate everyone's preferences, ONLY at the 12 noon Mass, the righthand side of the pews will be mask-optional for totally vaccinated parishioners.

Masked parishioners may sit anywhere in the church. But unvaccinated, and those uncomfortable around unmasked people, are encouraged to sit on the left, to maintain their social distance from those without masks.

But ALL are required to wear a mask when lining up for communion.

Upon leaving mass, please do not congregate in the narthex, but immediately exit to the outside.

Lighting the Advent Candles and Building the Manger




During the season of Advent, Devotions, along with the traditional lighting of the Advent candles, will include the procession of "Nativity figures" at the beginning of the Mass.

The Archdiocese of New York requires Confirmation Candidates to attend a retreat. If for some reason you are unable to join the scheduled retreat, you will have to inquire and register in other parishes' Confirmation Retreat before your Confirmation Day.
