

Easter 2023

"There was a great earthquake, for an Angel of the Lord descended from heaven, approached, rolled back the stone, and sat upon it." Matthew 28:1–10

Dear Parishioners:

Each of us has experienced an awakening when suddenly a ray of light has broken through the darkness of our hopelessness, fear or grief, allowing us to put the darkness behind us to start anew. At one time or another, each of us has been stopped in our tracks by a bolt of lightning that has permitted us to see the danger we did not understand or the path forward we failed to understand.

Each "earthquake" experienced can release us from the "tomb" we did not realize we had dug for ourselves, so we can reach a new understanding. When we dislodge the "stone", we can find a way around our regret, grief, fear and anxiety that block where we need to go or what we need to do.

In each of these moments, we find ourselves standing before Easter's empty tomb – the sign of perfect hope. We may be unsettled at first or even afraid, but if we realize that in Christ all things are possible and open our hearts to God's grace, we can overcome the "darkness." We may find the Risen Christ in the generosity and support of an "angel," such as a friend who stayed with us through the night or the wise teacher, counselor or mentor who set us on a new path.

Easter is not about the past in Jerusalem but the hope that awaits us in Galilee. It is filled with the promise of new things that we can realize by embracing love, compassion, forgiveness, reconciliation, justice and peace.

I pray each of us will not fear or shrink away from Easter morning's first light and broken stones but accept God's invitation to embrace His light and hope promised in the Risen One who is forever in our midst.

On behalf of Father Raymond and the entire Parish staff of the Church of Saint Pius X, I wish you a blessed Easter!






