

Saint Pius X (June 2, 1835 – August 20, 1914), August 21

Pope Pius X is perhaps best remembered for his encouragement of the frequent reception of Holy Communion, especially by children.



The second of 10 children in a poor Italian family, Joseph Sarto became Pius X at age 68. He

was one of the 20th century's greatest popes.

Ever mindful of his humble origin, Pope Pius stated, "I was born poor, I lived poor, I will die poor." He was embarrassed by some of the pomp of the papal court. "Look how they have dressed me up," he said in tears to an old friend. To another, "It is a penance to be forced to accept all these practices. They lead me around surrounded by soldiers like Jesus when he was seized in Gethsemani."

Interested in politics, Pope Pius encouraged Italian Catholics to become more politically involved. One of his first papal acts was to end the supposed right of governments to interfere by veto in papal elections—a practice that reduced the freedom of the 1903 conclave which had elected him.

In 1905, when France renounced its agreement with the Holy See and threatened confiscation of Church property if governmental control of Church affairs were not granted, Pius X courageously rejected the demand.

... He denounced the ill treatment of indigenous peoples on the plantations of Peru, sent a relief commission to Messina after an earthquake, and sheltered refugees at his own expense.

On the 11th anniversary of his election as pope, Europe was plunged into World War I. Pius had foreseen it, but it killed him. "This is the last affliction the Lord will visit on me…" He died a few weeks after the war began, and was canonized in 1954.

The Synod on Synodality is a three-year process of listening and dialogue. In advance of its first session, which will take place in Rome in October 2023, the need for the Catholic Church to be more inclusive of minority groups, such as the LGBTQ+ Catholic community, has emerged. Join us to talk with Father James Martin, SJ about how to build a bridge to overcome the chasm between the official response from our Church and her LGBTQ+ faithful members. Father James Martin SJ is a Jesuit Priest, editor-atlarge of the Jesuit magazine America and consultant to the Vatican's Secretariat for Communications. He has been appointed by Pope Francis as a member of the upcoming Synod on Synodality. (https://www. americamagazine.org/politics-society/2023/07/11/ jim-martin-syond-pope-lgbtg-voices-245668) Father Martin is the founder of Outreach, a group that promotes inclusivity and welcome for LGBTQ Catholics in the church. He is the author of many books, including Building a Bridge: How the Catholic Church and the LGBT Community Can Enter Into a Relationship of Respect, Compassion, and Sensitivity. His latest, Come Forth: The Promise of Jesus's Greatest Miracle, will be released in September. A frequent commentator in the media about issues of religion and spirituality, he is known for his appearances on The Colbert Report and his robust social media presence.

Ten years ago, we brought the dream of our parish's founders to fruition by completing the renovation of our Church – a renovation that has significantly facilitated our growth and vibrancy and helped us to spread our faith. As good stewards, we must periodically inspect, maintain and repair our facilities and grounds. Consistent with this responsibility, we have determined that certain projects (for which we have received competitive bids and have chosen contractors based on their pricing and reputation) need to be addressed.

We thank the many parishioners who have donated already towards our **Church of St. Pius X 2023** – **2024 Maintenance Projects** and ask those parishioners who have not donated to consider sponsoring or contributing towards an item noted below that still needs funding:

•Seal coat and crack seal the parking lot	\$14,955
•Replace a portion of the fencing around the field and add new bollards	
with concrete footings to prevent cars from hitting the fence	10,995
•Replace four (4) of the school's air conditioning systems with dual	
heating and a/c units (including related wiring and piping)	(each) 16,000
•Check all fire and carbon monoxide detectors, smoke beam detectors	
and fire alarm pull handles in the church and school	3,995
•Repair fire alarm pull handles, beam detectors, smoke detectors	
and upgrade the carbon monoxide detectors.	6,250
•Philips Heartstart Onsite Defibrillator (3 Units)	(each) 1,700
