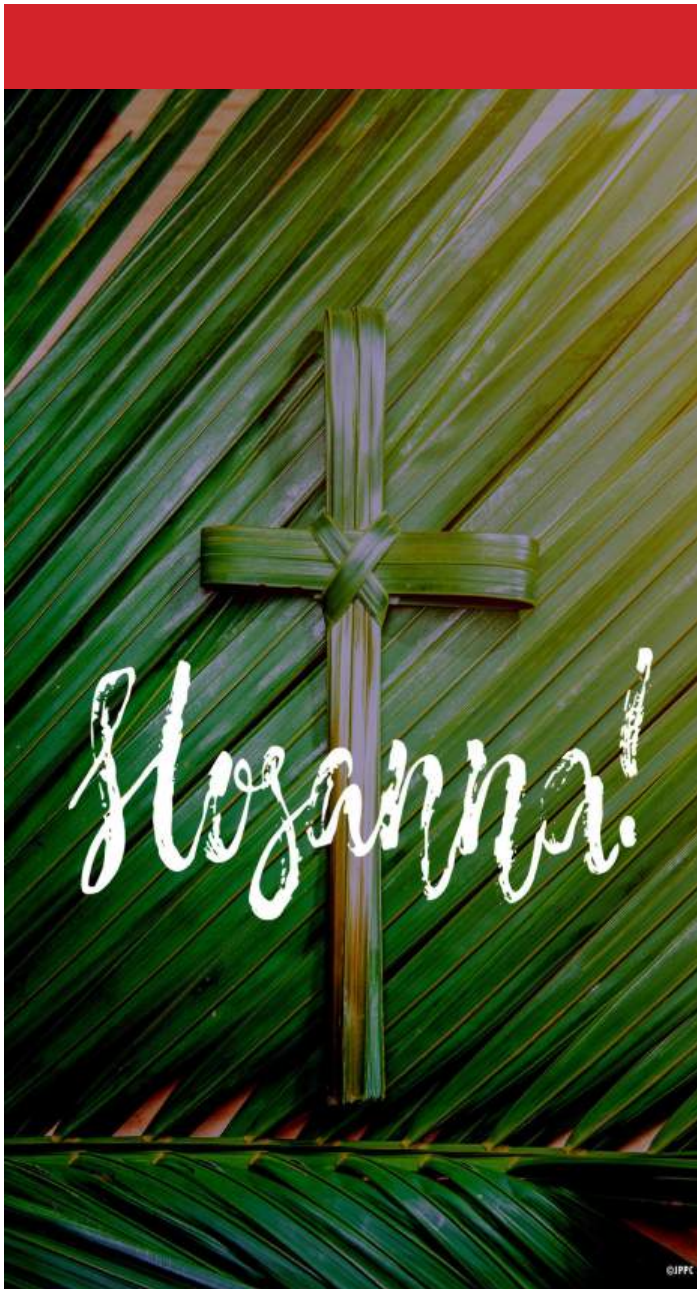

Holy Thursday

Holy Thursday is more than just the lead-in to Good Friday; it is, in fact, the oldest of the celebrations of Holy Week.

And with good reason: Holy Thursday is the day on which Catholics commemorate the institution of three pillars of the Catholic Faith: the Sacrament of Holy Communion, the priesthood, and the Mass. During the Last Supper, Christ blessed the bread and wine ... In telling His disciples to “Do this in remembrance of Me,” He instituted the Mass and made them the first priests.



Near the end of the Last Supper, after Judas had departed, Christ said to His disciples, “A new commandment I give unto you: That you love one another, as I have loved you, that you also love one another.” The Latin word for “commandment,” *mandatum* became the source for another name for Holy Thursday: *Maundy Thursday*.

On Holy Thursday, the priests of each diocese gather with their bishop to consecrate holy oils, which are used throughout the year for the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, Holy Orders, and the Anointing of the Sick. This ancient practice, which goes back to the fifth century, is known as the Chrism Mass ...

... [There] is only one Mass other than the Chrism Mass celebrated on Holy Thursday in each church: the Mass of the Lord’s Supper, which is celebrated after sundown. It commemorates the institution of the Sacrament of Holy Communion, and it ends with the removal of the Body of Christ from the tabernacle in the main body of the church. The Eucharist is carried in procession to another place where it is kept overnight, to be distributed during the commemoration of the Lord’s Passion on Good Friday. After the procession, the altar is stripped bare, and all bells in the church are silent until the Gloria at the Easter Vigil on Holy Saturday.

Dear Padre

March 24, 2024

I am the divorced mother of three young children. My daughter is making her first Communion and I want to go to Communion with her. But I haven’t been to Mass in three years because of my divorce. I am nervous and embarrassed about returning to the Church. What can I do?

Sharing in your daughter’s preparation for holy Communion is a lovely desire and a good chance to look closely at your own faith; it may be the “little push” you need. She needs to see in you someone who has faith and is committed to the Church. Taking your children to Mass each Sunday is a good start.

You mentioned that you haven’t been to church in three years because of your divorce. You may be confused about the teachings of the Church concerning divorce. Divorced Catholics are still full members of the Church and can receive holy Communion. If you have remarried outside the Church, it is a more complicated issue, yet not hopeless.

Since you haven’t been to Mass in three years, the first step is to talk to your pastor or another priest with whom you feel comfortable. Be honest. Explain why you have stayed away from the Church. Then set up a time to go to confession. And please don’t be ashamed or embarrassed about coming back to church. No matter how long it has been, the Church welcomes you home. ●

The Tenebrae service, a traditional Christian liturgy, is observed during Holy Week, particularly on Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, or Holy Saturday, commonly associated with the Roman Catholic Church.

"Tenebrae," derived from Latin for "shadows" or "darkness," involves the gradual extinguishing of candles, symbolizing deepening darkness as the Passion of Christ unfolds. Readings include passages from the Lamentations of Jeremiah and other Scriptures related to Jesus' suffering and death.

Join us at the Church of St. Pius X for the Tenebrae service on Good Friday, March 29, at 7:30 PM. Experience readings from Scriptures, reflections, silent prayer, and songs for the congregation, concluding with communion. Our aim is to offer a reflective and spiritual experience during Holy Week.

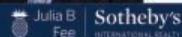
