Saint Junipero Serra (November 24, 1713 – August 28, 1784), July 1

In 1776, when the American Revolution was beginning in the east, another part of the future United States was being born in California. That year a gray-robed Franciscan founded Mission San Juan Capistrano, now famous for its annually returning swallows. San Juan was the seventh of nine missions established under the direction of this indomitable Spaniard.



Born on Spain's island of Mallorca, Serra entered the Franciscan Order taking the name of Saint Francis' childlike companion, Brother Juniper. Until he was 35, he spent most of his time in the classroom—first as a student of theology and then as a professor. He also became famous for his preaching. Suddenly he gave it all up and followed ... the missionary work of Saint Francis Solano in South America. Junipero's desire was to convert native peoples in the New World.

Arriving by ship at Vera Cruz, Mexico, he and a companion walked the 250 miles to Mexico City. On the way Junipero's left leg became infected by an insect bite and would remain a cross—sometimes life-threatening—for the rest of his life. For 18 years, he worked in central Mexico and in the Baja Peninsula. He became president of the missions there.

... Junipero's missionary life was a long battle with cold and hunger, with unsympathetic military commanders and even with danger of death from non-Christian native peoples. Through it all his unquenchable zeal was fed by prayer each night, often from midnight till dawn. He baptized over 6,000 people and confirmed 5,000. His travels would have circled the globe. He brought the Native Americans not only the gift of faith but also a decent standard of living.

Does God have a plan for each of us?

We collaborate with God through continual prayer and discernment in planning out our best path of life. This path allows us to fulfill God's ultimate plan—namely, to find meaning in the life he gave us, enjoy his friendship while on earth, and spend eternal life with him in heaven.

God doesn't force us to live out our existence in some programmed, robotic way according to a predestined plan or inevitable fate over which we have no control. Rather, we're free and responsible for our own actions.

Moreover, God's plan for each of us is to experience his profound love and love him in return. "God is love, and whoever remains in love remains in God and God in him" (1 John 4:16). As the supreme sign of God's love, his plan of salvation from the beginning of time was to send us his only begotten Son. "Jesus' violent death was not the result of chance in an unfortunate coincidence of circumstances, but is part of the mystery of God's plan, as St. Peter explains...in his first sermon on Pentecost: 'This Jesus [was] delivered up according to the definite plan and foreknowledge of God'" (*Catechism of the Catholic Church*, 599). "By giving up his own Son for our sins, God manifests that his plan for us is one of benevolent love, prior to any merit on our part" (CCC 604). ●

IMPORTANT UPCOMING EVENTS FOR RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

Volunteers Needed to Spread the Good News!

The **Parish Religious Education Program** endeavors to bring the Gospel message to all the Catholic families in the Parish. Throughout the years, our Religious Education thrives because of the generosity and dedication of volunteers who contribute in various ways in nurturing the hearts and minds of our young ones.

This year, the R.E. needs volunteers who are willing to serve as either **teacher's assistants** or **hall monitor** to be able to effectively facilitate the learning of our students. High school students are welcome to apply!

Teacher's Assistants work closely with the teacher during religious education classes. They assist in preparing materials, setting up the classroom, implementing class projects and ensuring a smooth flow of activities. They help monitor the students to maintain discipline and order in the classroom. They check class attendance, and when needed, the assistants accompany students who may need to go out of the classroom (e.g. to use the restroom).

Hall Monitors ensure the safety of students and staff while classes are in session. They monitor entrances, hallways, and common areas to maintain order and minimize disruptions. They prevent unauthorized access and address any security concerns. They note and, if necessary, attend to any unusual patterns, such as late arrivals or early departures of students. In case of emergencies (fire drills, lockdowns, etc.), hall monitors assist in evacuations and follow established protocols.

R.E. volunteers needed for next year:

- 1st Grade - **4 Assistants**
- 2nd Grade - **2 Assistants**
- 3rd Grade - **1 Assistant**
- 6th Grade - **1 Assistant**
- 7th Grade - **1 Assistant**
- **1 Hall Monitor (on Mondays)**

All volunteers will need to submit to a **background check** and complete the **Safe Environment Training Program** prescribed by the Archdiocese of New York.
