***Saint Monica (c. 330 – 387),  
August 27***



The circumstances of Saint Monica's life could have made her a nagging wife, a bitter daughter-in-law, and a despairing parent, yet she did not give way to any of these temptations.

Although she was a Christian, her parents gave her in marriage to a pagan, Patricius, who lived in her hometown of Tagaste in North Africa. Patricius had some redeeming features, but he had a violent temper and was licentious. Monica also had to bear with a cantankerous mother-in-law who lived in her home ... Monica's prayers and example finally won her husband and mother-in-law to Christianity ...

[Monica's oldest child], Augustine ... was 17 and a rhetoric student in Carthage. Monica was distressed to learn that her son had accepted the Manichean heresy—"all flesh is evil"—and was living an immoral life. For a while, she refused to let him eat or sleep in her house. Then one night she had a vision that assured her Augustine would return to the faith. From that time on, she stayed close to her son ... In fact she often stayed much closer than Augustine wanted.

When he was 29, Augustine decided to go to Rome to teach rhetoric. Monica was determined to go along. One night ... he set sail for Rome. Monica was heartbroken ... but she still followed him. She arrived in Rome only to find that he had left for Milan. Although travel was difficult, Monica pursued him to Milan.

In Milan, Augustine came under the influence of the bishop, Saint Ambrose, who also became Monica's spiritual director ... Monica became a leader of the devout women in Milan as she had been in Tagaste.

She continued her prayers for Augustine during his years of instruction. At Easter 387, Saint Ambrose baptized Augustine and several of his friends. Soon after, his party left for Africa ... She became ill shortly after and suffered severely for nine days before her death.

# Dear Padre

**August 25, 2024**

***A friend claims that various saints have appeared to her. Is this something that really happens?***

Your friend might be experiencing what are called "private" revelations. Many recognized saints experienced visions in which Jesus, Mary, or the disciples spoke to them. These revelations were sometimes the sparks that caused future saints to leave whatever they were doing and follow Jesus in a dynamic way.

Saint Francis of Assisi was a rich young man who had a vision of Christ that radically changed his life. After this private revelation, Francis embraced poverty and devoted himself to the care of the sick. He founded the Franciscans to carry on his mission. An example of recent private revelations are the apparitions at *Medjugorje*. Even though the Church has not formally recognized these revelations, many have discovered a deeper faith because of them.

The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* says this about private revelations: "Throughout the ages, there have been so-called "private" revelations, some of which have been recognized by the authority of the Church. They do not belong, however, to the deposit of faith. It is not their role to improve or complete Christ's definitive Revelation, but to help live more fully by it in a certain period of history" (CCC 67).

It is important to note whether the private revelation is contrary to the faith or the morals of the Church, and whether a particular revelation brings one closer to God. ●



**Summer is a tough time for food pantries across the country because of people being away from their parishes for summer vacations, etc.**



## IMPORTANT UPCOMING EVENTS FOR RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

### Volunteers Needed to Spread the Good News!

The **Parish Religious Education Program** endeavors to bring the Gospel message to all the Catholic families in the Parish. Throughout the years, our Religious Education thrives because of the generosity and dedication of volunteers who contribute in various ways in nurturing the hearts and minds of our young ones.

This year, the R.E. needs volunteers who are willing to serve as either **teacher's assistants** or **hall monitor** to be able to effectively facilitate the learning of our students. High school students are welcome to apply!

**Teacher's Assistants** work closely with the teacher during religious education classes. They assist in preparing materials, setting up the classroom, implementing class projects and ensuring a smooth flow of activities. They help monitor the students to maintain discipline and order in the classroom. They check class attendance, and when needed, the assistants accompany students who may need to go out of the classroom (e.g. to use the restroom).

**Hall Monitors** ensure the safety of students and staff while classes are in session. They monitor entrances, hallways, and common areas to maintain order and minimize disruptions. They prevent unauthorized access and address any security concerns. They note and, if necessary, attend to any unusual patterns, such as late arrivals or early departures of students. In case of emergencies (fire drills, lockdowns, etc.), hall monitors assist in evacuations and follow established protocols.

R.E. volunteers needed for next year:

- 1st Grade - **4 Assistants**
- 2nd Grade - **2 Assistants**
- 3rd Grade - **1 Assistant**
- 6th Grade - **1 Assistant**
- 7th Grade - **1 Assistant**
- **1 Hall Monitor (on Mondays)**

All volunteers will need to submit to a **background check** and complete the **Safe Environment Training Program** prescribed by the Archdiocese of New York.
