Exaltation of the Holy Cross, September 14

Early in the fourth century St. Helena, mother of the Roman Emperor Constantine, went to Jerusalem in search of the holy places of Christ's life. She razed the second-century Temple of Aphrodite, which tradition held was built over the Savior's tomb, and her son built the Basilica of the Holy Sepulcher over the tomb. During the excavation, workers found three crosses. Legend has it that the one on which Jesus died was identified when its touch healed a dying woman.



The cross immediately became an object of veneration. At a Good Friday celebration in Jerusalem toward the end of the fourth century... the wood was taken out of its silver container and placed on a table together with the inscription Pilate ordered placed above Jesus' head: Then "all the people pass through one by one; all of them bow down, touching the cross and the inscription, first with their foreheads, then with their eyes; and, after kissing the cross, they move on."

To this day the Eastern Churches, Catholic and Orthodox alike, celebrate the Exaltation of the Holy Cross on the September anniversary of the basilica's dedication. The feast entered the Western calendar in the seventh century after Emperor Heraclius recovered the cross from the Persians, who had carried it off in 614, 15 years earlier. According to the story, the emperor intended to carry the cross back into Jerusalem himself, but was unable to move forward until he took off his imperial garb and became a barefoot pilgrim.

Comment:

...To the eyes of the first Christians, [the cross] had no beauty. It stood outside too many city walls, decorated only with decaying corpses... Although believers spoke of the cross as the instrument of salvation, it seldom appeared in Christian art unless disguised as an anchor or the Chi-Rho until after Constantine's edict of toleration.

Dear Padre

What is the "gospel of prosperity"? Does it mean that being rich is a sign of God's favor?

That's a good question, as this month we listen to the challenging words of St. James. If there is a "gospel of prosperity," Matthew, Mark, Luke, or John didn't write it, and it isn't about Jesus. If anything, the Gospels would be called "Gospels of poverty." Jesus himself was born in poverty. Had he wished to extol riches and prosperity, he would have been born into the lap of luxury. But God chose the poverty of a stable.

Although the subject of riches and poverty appears in all the Gospels, Luke writes about it the most. It is thought that Luke was concerned about this topic because he came from wealth and dealt with people of means. Luke sees money and goods as dangerous to salvation. Although "nothing will be impossible for God" (Luke 1:37), Luke uses the image of a camel passing through the eye of a needle to explain that this impossible task is easier than for a rich person to enter the kingdom of heaven (Luke 18:25). Scary words. Yet, poverty itself is not hailed as good, nor are riches condemned in themselves. It's what wealth does to people that is the core issue. When we focus on riches and possessions, we risk turning from God and growing deaf to the cries of the poor. Possessions and wealth are to be shared, not hoarded. ●

Calls for expanded and fuller participation of women in church leadership have been heard throughout the multiyear synod process. In the synthesis document produced at the end of the Rome meeting in October 2023, the need to “ensure that women can participate in decision-making processes and assume roles of responsibility in pastoral care and ministry” was among a few issues described as “urgent.” Please join us for an enlightening conversation about possible pathways for women’s leadership in the Catholic church.

Dr. Imperatori-Lee is Director of the Catholic Studies Program at Manhattan College, NY. Her research studies focus on the relationship between Catholic theology, sexuality, and education; the intersection of Mariology and ecclesiology; intercultural theology; gender studies; and the relationship of women, the poor and other marginalized groups to church structure and governance.

She has served on the governing boards of the Catholic Theological Society of America, and of the Academy of Catholic Hispanic Theologians of the U.S. She is a member of these organizations as well as the American Academy of Religion. She has also served on the board of FutureChurch.

Her latest book *Women and the Church - From Devil's Gateway to Discipleship* will be available for sale at the event.

IMPORTANT UPCOMING EVENTS FOR RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

Volunteers Needed to Spread the Good News!

The **Parish Religious Education Program** endeavors to bring the Gospel message to all the Catholic families in the Parish. Throughout the years, our Religious Education thrives because of the generosity and dedication of volunteers who contribute in various ways in nurturing the hearts and minds of our young ones.

This year, the R.E. needs volunteers who are willing to serve as either **teacher's assistants** or **hall monitor** to be able to effectively facilitate the learning of our students. High school students are welcome to apply!

Teacher's Assistants work closely with the teacher during religious education classes. They assist in preparing materials, setting up the classroom, implementing class projects and ensuring a smooth flow of activities. They help monitor the students to maintain discipline and order in the classroom. They check class attendance, and when needed, the assistants accompany students who may need to go out of the classroom (e.g. to use the restroom).

Hall Monitors ensure the safety of students and staff while classes are in session. They monitor entrances, hallways, and common areas to maintain order and minimize disruptions. They prevent unauthorized access and address any security concerns. They note and, if necessary, attend to any unusual patterns, such as late arrivals or early departures of students. In case of emergencies (fire drills, lockdowns, etc.), hall monitors assist in evacuations and follow established protocols.

R.E. volunteers needed for next year:

- 1st Grade - **3 Assistants**
- 2nd Grade - **1 Assistant**
- 3rd Grade - **1 Assistant**
- 6th Grade - **1 Assistant**
- 7th Grade - **1 Assistant**
- **1 Hall Monitor (on Mondays)**

All volunteers will need to submit to a **background check** and complete the **Safe Environment Training Program** prescribed by the Archdiocese of New York.
