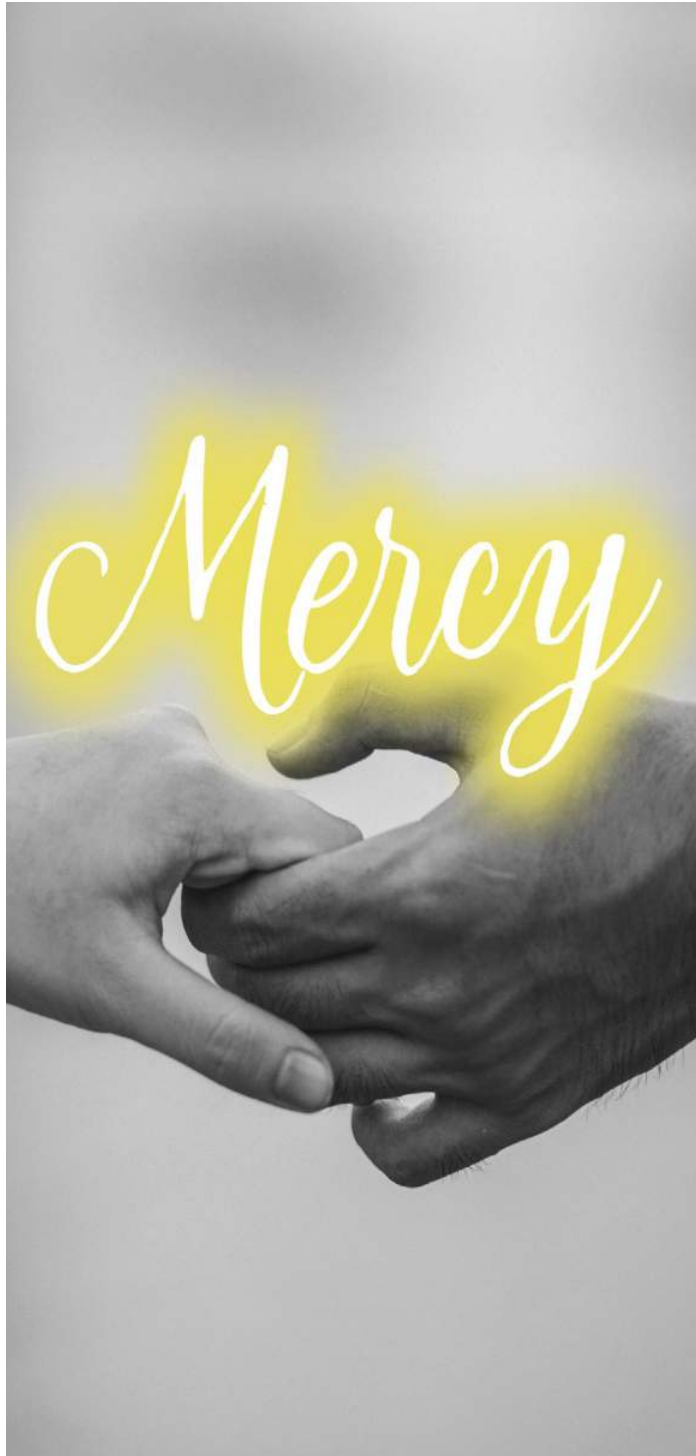

Dear Padre

July 13, 2025

I have a question about the prayer the priest says after the Our Father. Someone told me it's called an "embolism." Why don't we just end with "Amen" like when we say it at home?

You have correctly identified the "embolism" or "interpretation" that has been added to the Lord's Prayer during the sacred liturgy. It reads, "Deliver us, Lord, we pray, from every evil, graciously grant peace in our days, that, by the help of your mercy, we may be always free from sin and safe from all distress, as we await the blessed hope and the coming of our Savior, Jesus Christ." This addition, ancient in its use during the eucharistic liturgy, is a further explanation of the content and the intercessory nature of the prayer. It develops the last petition of the Lord's Prayer and asks for deliverance from the power of evil for the whole community of the faithful. It is an appropriate insertion, reflecting the purpose of the eucharistic gathering as spiritual but also as a celebration of the Lord's words and directions to us. In private prayer, the embolism would be out of place.

The sacred liturgy is filled with intercessory prayers, acclamations, and bits and pieces of ancient eucharistic prayers and blessings. Everything has been carefully chosen and placed within the celebration of the sacred liturgy to assist the faithful who gather to lift their minds and hearts to the Heavenly Father, through his Son Jesus, by the power of the Holy Spirit. ●

Quotes from a Journal News article dated 6/22/25:

"More than 355,000 people in the regional food bank's 23-county service area are food insecure - meaning they don't always know where they will find their next meal. 15.4% of children in the region experience food insecurity."

Religious Education

Volunteers Needed for the 2025-2026 School Year to Spread the Good News!

Our Religious Education is so grateful for the generosity and dedication of volunteers who contribute in various ways in nurturing the hearts and minds of the young members of our parish. If you feel called to serve as a catechist, catechist aide or hall monitor, below is a brief description of their responsibilities:

- **Catechists** are responsible for teaching and guiding students in their faith formation, following the curriculum prescribed by the Archdiocese of New York. This role requires a strong knowledge and commitment to the faith, the ability to communicate religious teachings effectively. Diocesan training sessions are available through the ArchNYLAB catechist training portal.
- **Catechist Aides** work closely with the teacher during religious education classes. They assist in preparing materials, setting up the classroom, implementing class projects and ensuring a smooth flow of activities. They help maintain discipline and order in the classroom, check class attendance, and whenever needed, accompany students who may need to go out of the classroom (e.g. to use the restroom).
- **Hall Monitors** ensure the safety of students and staff while classes are in session. They monitor entrances, hallways, and common areas to maintain order and minimize disruptions. They note and, if necessary, attend to any unusual patterns, such as late arrivals or early departures of students. In case of emergency, they assist in evacuations and follow established protocols.

All volunteers will need to submit to a background check and complete the Safe Environment Training Program prescribed by the Archdiocese of New York.

Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time (C)

Isaiah 66:10-14c / Galatians 6:14-18 /

Luke 10:1-12, 17-20 or 10:1-9

If you could change one aspect of your life, what would that be? Financial instability? Arthritis? Addiction? A disruptive family member? Work's daily grind? Finding love? No doubt the answers are as varied as the people who answer the question.

Though the old poster advises us to "bloom where you are planted," sometimes we can feel as if we've been planted among weeds—the people we've been given, the problems that continually pop up, the conflicts that all too often shut out the peace we seek. Just as Jesus sends disciples into every place he intends to visit, the reality for us may very well be that he sends us into the very lives we live even though we wish we could change them. Where we are is where we've been sent. It is in the lives we have that we work out our salvation, for Jesus said, "The kingdom of God is at hand for you" (Luke 10:9).

St. Paul emphasized how important it is for disciples of Jesus to live out their identity as a new creation. British artist and sculptor Henry Moore made the observation that, in life, it is most important that we give ourselves over to a goal or dream, something so all-consuming that we live it morning, noon, and night. And the most important aspect of it, he said, is that it must be something we cannot possibly accomplish. For the followers of Jesus, it is the lifelong task to bloom where we've been planted. ●

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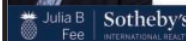
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
