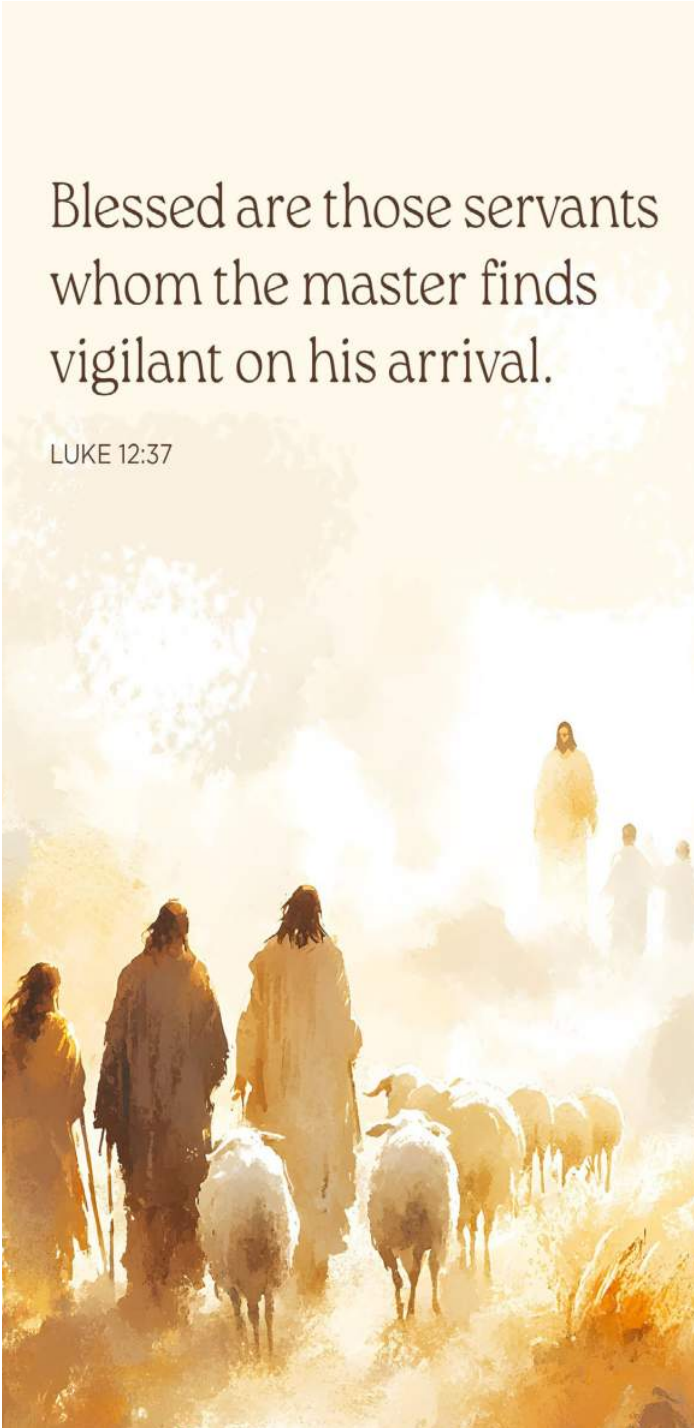

The Story of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary

On November 1, 1950, Pope Pius XII defined the Assumption of Mary to be a dogma of faith: “We pronounce, declare and define it to be a divinely revealed dogma that the immaculate Mother of God, the ever Virgin Mary, having completed the course of her earthly life, was assumed body and soul to heavenly glory.” The pope proclaimed this dogma only after a broad consultation of bishops, theologians and laity. There were few dissenting voices. What the pope solemnly declared was already a common belief in the Catholic Church.

We find homilies on the Assumption going back to the sixth century. In following centuries, the Eastern Churches held steadily to the doctrine, but some authors in the West were hesitant. However by the 13th century there was universal agreement. The feast was celebrated under various names—Commemoration, Dormition, Passing, Assumption—from at least the fifth or sixth century. Today it is celebrated as a solemnity.

Scripture does not give an account of Mary’s assumption into heaven. Nevertheless, Revelation 12 speaks of a woman who is caught up in the battle between good and evil. Many see this woman as God’s people. Since Mary best embodies the people of both Old and New Testaments, her assumption can be seen as an exemplification of the woman’s victory.

Furthermore, in 1 Corinthians 15:20, Paul speaks of Christ’s resurrection as the first fruits of those who have fallen asleep.

Since Mary is closely associated with all the mysteries of Jesus’ life, it is not surprising that the Holy Spirit has led the Church to believe in Mary’s share in his glorification. So close was she to Jesus on earth, she must be with him body and soul in heaven.

Father Peter Donohue, born in Bronx, NY, and raised in Royal Oak, Michigan, earned his BA with a concentration in theatre and communication arts from Villanova University in 1975, and was ordained an Augustinian priest in 1979. He holds advanced degrees in theatre and theology, including a PhD from the University of Illinois, where he also taught and received honors for outstanding teaching.

A tenured professor at Villanova, he chaired the Department of Theatre from 1992 to 2006, directing numerous productions and earning multiple Barrymore Award nominations and one Barrymore Award for Outstanding Direction of a Musical.

Since becoming Villanova’s 32nd president in 2006, Fr. Donohue has led major strategic initiatives, a record-breaking fundraising campaign, extensive campus improvements, and efforts to enhance academic reputation and student opportunities—all while reinforcing the University’s Augustinian, Catholic mission.

SPX Celebrates Women in the Church

St. Phoebe's Day Celebration - Sunday, September 7 at noon Mass
WOMEN'S ROLE IN THE CATHOLIC CHURCH - FROM VATICAN II TO TODAY

The Second Vatican Council (1962–1965) brought major changes to the Church, renewing its engagement with the modern world and expanding lay participation. It encouraged greater involvement of women in ministries, education, and liturgy, leading to increased participation as lectors, extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion, and parish leaders. While it didn't change doctrine on ordination, it laid the foundation for women's greater involvement in the Church's mission.

Under Pope Francis, women's roles have gained renewed focus, with more inclusion in Church decision-making. Though the ban on women's ordination remains, he has taken cautious steps—appointing women to senior Vatican roles, commissioning studies on women deacons, updating Canon Law to include women as lectors and acolytes, and expanding their role in the Synod. While progress is noted, critics argue these measures are largely symbolic and fall short of true structural change.

SPX Phoebe Circle

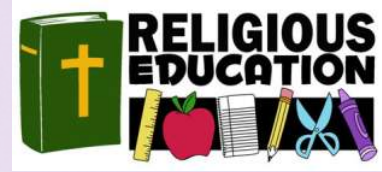
Volunteers Needed for the 2025-2026 School Year to Spread the Good News!

Our Religious Education is so grateful for the generosity and dedication of volunteers who contribute in various ways in nurturing the hearts and minds of the young members of our parish. If you feel called to serve as a catechist, catechist aide or hall monitor, below is a brief description of their responsibilities:

- **Catechists** are responsible for teaching and guiding students in their faith formation, following the curriculum prescribed by the Archdiocese of New York. This role requires a strong knowledge and commitment to the faith, the ability to communicate religious teachings effectively. Diocesan training sessions are available through the ArchNYLAB catechist training portal.
- **Catechist Aides** work closely with the teacher during religious education classes. They assist in preparing materials, setting up the classroom, implementing class projects and ensuring a smooth flow of activities. Volunteers Needed:
 - **1st Grade - 2**
 - **2nd Grade - 2**
 - **5th Grade - 1**
 - **7th Grade - 1**
 - **8th Grade - 2**
- **Hall Monitors** ensure the safety of students and staff while classes are in session. They monitor entrances, hallways, and common areas to maintain order and minimize disruptions. They note and, if necessary, attend to any unusual patterns, such as late arrivals or early departures of students. In case of emergency, they assist in evacuations and follow established protocols.

All volunteers will need to submit to a background check and complete the Safe Environment Training Program prescribed by the Archdiocese of New York. **Assistants can also volunteer for a semester or on call.**

Where did the Virgin Mary spend her last days on earth? Ephesus or Jerusalem?

Shortly before Jesus died on the cross, he entrusted his widowed mother to the protective care of John the Evangelist. (See John 19:26–27.) Accordingly, when John lived his final years in Ephesus, it is believed that Mary also spent her last days nearby in a modest stone dwelling, before being assumed body and soul into heaven “to be preserved from the corruption of the tomb” (Pope Pius XII, *Munificentissimus Deus*, 1950). Moreover, it is likely in Ephesus (present-day Turkey) where the tradition of Mary’s Assumption started.

Pope Benedict XIV (1740–1758) declared Ephesus was “where the Blessed Mother... proceeded from this life into heaven.” More recent popes, such as Paul VI in 1967 and John Paul II in 1979, prayed in this venerable home, known as Mother Mary’s House.

However, close to Gethsemane in Jerusalem is the Basilica of the Tomb of Mary from the fifth century. It is built around an ancient crypt where Mary’s body was believed to have been laid before it was assumed into heaven.

While both Ephesus and Jerusalem claim to be the location where the Virgin Mary spent her last years on earth, experts contend the latter is the older tradition and the more credible place. Even if Mary temporarily left Jerusalem, it is probable she returned to the land of her birth and resided there at the end of her earthly life. ●

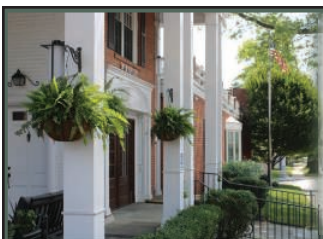
