Dear Parishioners:

Our parish is a thriving community of faithful individuals dedicated to sharing their time, talent and treasures with their fellow brothers and sisters. I am awed by the numerous compassionate individuals who donate countless hours to make our parish the community it has become.

This past year, we welcomed 59 new families to our parish and 43 new families to our Religious Education Program. Caring volunteers joined together to assist unwed expectant mothers, the working poor, prison inmates, the elderly and the disabled. My Sister's Place honored our parish with a Community Partner's Award.



Our Safety Committee composed of Anthony Fiorenza, Michael Cosgrove, and Frank Scinicariello assessed safety procedures in our parish and coordinated with the Scarsdale police and fire departments to formulate emergency plans. We purchased two defibrillators for emergency use and replaced the lighting and projectors in the main Church.

Our parish introduced a SmugMug page where pictures of events and special occasions are posted weekly. Our new Men's Ministry hosted a fish fry and a Life Skills Workshop. We celebrated Fr. Rocky's birthday and Alice Gaskin's 100th birthday. Our Concerts@SPX program hosted concerts featuring hymns dedicated to the Blessed Mother in memory of the late Margaret Cardillo and deceased SPX choir members and an afternoon of woodwind chamber music. We welcomed a new children's choir director, Kathleen Marino.

At our annual Volunteers and New Parishioners Reception, we gave Light of the World recognitions to Lucille Filardo, Al Naclerio, Carol and Felix Petrillo, and Beth Rosen for their service to the parish over the years. We also honored Aurelie Ferrara, Maria Pick, Marie and Frank Scinicariello, and Ester Wintergerst with Salt of the Earth service recognitions. The Parish Council welcomed Ann Marie Beck, Laurel Durkay, Monique Greenberg, Naju (Tony) Mancheril, and Wendy Synan and bid farewell to retiring members Maria Bediako, Jim Bruni, Marie-Helene McAndrew, Linda Puoplo, and Frank Scinicariello. We look forward to their continuing participation in our parish.

This past year, the parish had an operating surplus of \$7,245. Our Total Revenue exceeded our Total Expenses by \$132,436 as a result of the receipt of renovation, repair and maintenance pledges of \$150,822. Essentially all of these pledges have been paid in full and therefore we no longer will be receiving revenue from this source. The excess was added to our reserves.

We are projecting an operational deficit of \$150,456 for the 2025-2026 fiscal year. If our expenses exceed our regular revenue in the current fiscal year, it may be necessary to fund a portion of the deficit from one-time donations and bequests and the parish's reserves (as has been done in the recent past) unless there are increased annual collections. Accordingly, we ask each parishioner to prayerfully consider increasing his/her financial commitment to our parish so we can continue our good works.

Your continuing commitment to the Church of St. Pius X inspires me as your shepherd. As we begin our 72nd year, we ask God to bless our parish and to help us live up to our Mission Statement to be a welcoming and teaching community.

Social Action

Children’s Social Action Activities

An important component of our Religious Education Program involves teaching our children the importance of helping others less fortunate. During the past year, our students participated in various service projects which included: donating money to **Operation Rice Bowl**; hosting bake sales to support various charitable organizations such as **Lifting Up Westchester** by filling Easter/Spring baskets with goodies for the homeless children, the Westchester County Department of Corrections by purchasing soft covered Bibles for inmates, and **St. Bartholomew’s Soup Kitchen** by distributing socks, jeans, hats, gloves, and undergarments to the homeless; collecting unwanted Halloween candy for Santa’s Brunch, thank you baskets for local firemen, the Easter Egg Hunt and the homeless at St. Bartholomew’s Soup Kitchen; decorating place mats and bags and filling the bags with lunches for the homeless at **HOPE Community Center**; distributing food to the hungry at **St. Peter’s/St. Denis’ Food Pantry**; entertaining residents of **St. Cabrini Nursing Home** by singing Christmas Carols and assisting with BINGO; packing gifts from our **Angel Giving Tree**; serving the homeless at St. Bartholomew’s Soup Kitchen; making valentines for, and delivering chocolates and flowers to, **St. Pius X elderly parishioners**; donating snacks, toiletries and sundries and preparing cards for our deployed military as part of **Operation Cupid – United for the Troops**; assisting guests at our parish’s **Annual Luncheon for People with Differing Abilities**; and donating food to our **Lenten Food Drive**.

Youth Ministry Social Action

The St. Pius X Youth Ministry for high school students, grades 9-12, endeavors to help them grow in their faith and spiritual lives by providing an array of group community service projects. During the year, our teens helped with the Parish's **Easter Egg Hunt**; delivered gifts and visited with **homebound parishioners** during the Christmas season; assisted with the book sale during the **Holiday Craft Fair and Market**; and sorted turkeys and packed cars in connection with our annual **Thanksgiving Food Drive**.

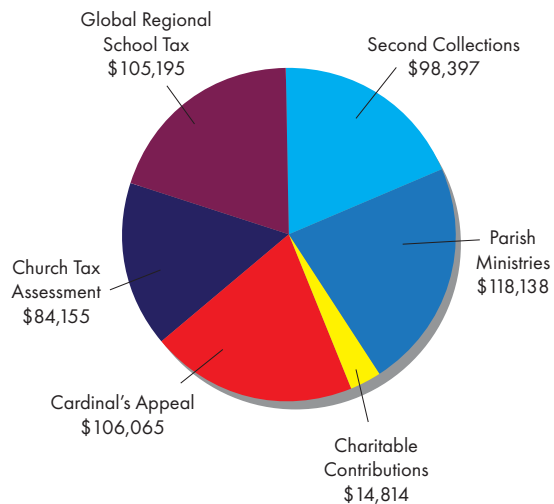
Adult/Family Social Action

In September, we held our annual Stewardship Weekend open house in the Narthex so our parishioners could learn how to become involved in our parish to help others less fortunate. This past year, our adult parishioners engaged in numerous social action activities including, among others: donating to various charitable organizations such as the **Hurricane Helene Relief Efforts**, **Catholic Relief Services**, **St. Joseph's Seminary**, **Retirement Fund for Religious** and **Missionary Church in the Philippines**; delivering 488 turkeys and 3 chickens with the fixings to the hungry during our **Thanksgiving Food Drive**; providing food to persons less fortunate through programs such as **St. Peter's/St. Denis' Food Pantry** and our **Lenten Food Drive**; holding our semi-annual Blood Drive; collecting coats for our annual **Coat Drive** for parishes in Port Chester; collecting items for babies and pregnant moms through our **Baby Shower Drive** for **Good Counsel Homes** and the **Sharing Shelf**; purchasing, wrapping and delivering Christmas gifts to needy persons at the **Holy Spirit Church**, **Don Bosco Church**, **Good Counsel Homes** and **St. Patrick's Nursing Home** through programs such as **Adopt-a-Family**, the **Christmas Angel Giving Tree** and the **St. Patrick's Nursing Home Christmas Wish List**; supplying computer tablets, traditional school supplies and backpacks for local children at **My Sister's Place**, the **Sharing Shelf** and the **Holy Spirit Church** and for Filipino children in **Fr. Raymond's religious education class** under our **Bag 2 School Program**; assisting with the cost of educating seminarians of the **Religious Community of the Alagad ni Maria** (Disciples of Mary); and knitting and crocheting items to donate to **Good Counsel Homes**, **Operation Gratitude** (an organization that supports our military, veterans and first responders), the **Linus Project** (an organization that supports needy children) and the **Sharing Shelf** through our **Thread for Life** ministry. In addition, we hosted our first annual **Holiday Craft Fair and Market** where vendors sold crafts, creations, services and non-homemade items to benefit the **St. Pius X Music Ministry**. The Market included a book sale with the proceeds used to purchase literacy workbooks for mothers in the **Good Counsel Home**. Finally, some members of our SPX Respect Life Team participated in **Walk with us to Prevent Suicide** to support the American Foundation for Suicide Prevention.

Liturgical Services for Children

Each month throughout the school year, one of the 10:30 am Family Masses was designated a **Ministry Mass** for a specified grade in our Religious Education Program. At these Masses, our students were active participants in the Mass as greeters, readers and presenters of the Gifts. We held our **Annual Backpack Blessing** at a Family Mass to remind our children that Christianity is a way of life that moves into all aspects of their lives and that God is with us always. Our second graders received their **Gold Books** at a **Mass of Blessing** in preparation for their First Reconciliation and First Holy Communion and attended a **Family Sacrament Day**. Our eighth grade Confirmation candidates came together at their **Inscription Service** to commit to do what was necessary to become Christian adults and attended a **Family Sacrament Day**. Our first through fourth grade religious education students practiced for our annual **Christmas pageant** and presented the pageant to the parish one Sunday after the Family Mass. During Lent, our students participated in a devotion to the **Stations of the Cross** and processed to the altar on Palm Sunday. Our children participated in a **Multicultural Mass with a Parade of Nations** on Pentecost Sunday. In May, our children were invited to bring a **flower offering** to the statue of Mary and to crown Mary. Under the direction of Kathleen Marino, our **Children's Choir** for students in kindergarten through eighth grade sang at select Sunday Family Masses. Our students were given the opportunity to go to confession during Advent and Lent.

Liturgical Services for Youth and Adults

Liturgical services this past year included: monthly **Birthday Blessings**; **Blessing and Commissioning of the Parish Council Mass**; **Catechetical Sunday** to commission our religious education catechists; **Blessing of the Animals** to celebrate the feast day of St. Francis of Assisi; **Grandparent's Day blessing**; **widows and widowers monthly Masses**; **Mass for alumni of Notre Dame University**; **Wedding Jubilee Mass** where couples renewed their marriage vows; **Parade of Nations** at our multicultural Mass on Pentecost Sunday with parishioners reading a Prayer of the Faithful in their own native tongue; **Virgin of Guadalupe Mass** with a procession carrying a portrait of the Virgin, roses and candles; **St. Phoebe's Mass** in honor and celebration of women in ministry; **blessing of expectant mothers and newborns**; semi-annual **Communal Anointing of the Sick Mass**; rosary devotions; **Mary's Birthday celebration**; **Mary Under the Stars celebration**; **Blessing of the Angel Tree**; **Lighting the Advent Wreath**; **Building the Manger**; outdoor **Christmas Tree lighting** celebration with caroling; Reconciliation Mondays before Christmas and Easter; **Light Up the Night** prayer service with Sr. Susan McCarthy; **Stations of the Cross** devotions; and **Triduum Rituals** including **washing of the feet**, **Tenebrae** and **Waters of Baptism**. Our Festival Choir under the direction of our Cantor, David Schmidt, performed during Christmas liturgies with a string quartet and throughout Holy Week.

The Sacraments

Our parish welcomed 51 new members, 4 adults and 47 infants into our community through Baptism in the past year. We prepared 7 couples for the Sacrament of Matrimony and united them in marriage.

In May, 70 second graders in our Religious Education Program made their First Reconciliation and received their First Holy Communion and 26 teens received the Gifts of the Holy Spirit and their commissioning as adults in our church at a Confirmation Liturgy with Bishop Dennis Sullivan. As part of their preparation to receive Confirmation, our eighth graders also attended a retreat at The Center at Mariandale. On Holy Saturday, four adults were baptized, made their First Reconciliation and received First Holy Communion and six adults were confirmed.

Scripture Study

This past year, our Adult Faith Formation Program explored what it means to be chosen by Jesus in the Chosen Series Bible Study for an hour on Thursday evenings under the direction of Charles Junjulas, via Zoom.

Speaker Series

In September, parishioners gathered to listen to Natalia M. Imperatore-Lee speak about Women in Today’s Church: Pathways to Full Discipleship.

Special Exhibition

The Eucharistic Miracle of the World Exhibition, which showcases the work of Carlo Acutis who cataloged every reported Eucharistic miracle prior to his death, which was scheduled to coincide with his canonization was postponed in light of Pope Francis’ death.

Retreats

In November, our parish hosted “Seasons of Change Spiritual Women’s Retreat” for women to engage in fellowship, self-reflection, meditation and prayer.

Children’s/Family Activities

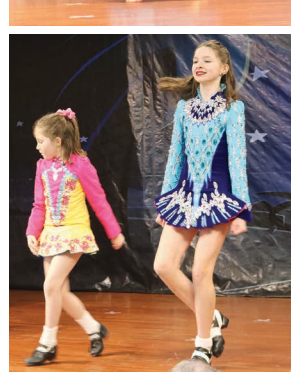
Our parish strives to include children in our parish family by organizing fun events for them. This year, activities with our children included: our annual **Family Picnic** with pizza, burgers, ice cream, face painting, a bounce house, bocce ball and yard games; **Brunch with Santa**; **Trunk or Treat**; **Easter Egg Hunt**; our annual **First Communion family reception**; our weekly **Family Hospitality Table** after the Sunday Family Masses; our first annual **Lunar Festival** celebrated in Asian cultures in recognition of the first new moon of the lunar calendar; our multi-cultural **Pentecost potluck luncheon** and a birthday lunch for Fr. Rocky.

As part of our **Concerts@SPX**, our parishioners, their friends and community members enjoyed West Side Winds, an afternoon of woodwind chamber music with a quartet of professional musicians, and Songs of Mary, an afternoon of hymns dedicated to the Blessed Mother sponsored by Ron Cardillo, in memory of his late wife, Margaret, and all deceased members of the St. Pius X Choir.

Adult Activities

Our parish welcomes all adult parishioners to participate in activities. This past year, adults participated in our annual **Christmas and St. Patrick’s Day luncheons**; **dinner and an afternoon tea recognizing our Religious Education Teachers, Assistants and Hall Monitors**; our annual **Volunteers and New Parishioner Reception**; an evening of **wine tasting**; hands on **flower arranging workshops**; monthly Masses followed by **social gatherings for our widows and widowers**; a **100th birthday celebration for Alice Gaskin**; a year end **dinner for St. Pius X Choir members**; and two sessions of our **Bereavement Support Group** for those mourning. In addition, our new **Men’s Ministry** hosted a Friday fish fry and a life skills workshop.





A Letter from the Finance Committee

November 2025

Dear Parishioners,

The following page contains detailed information regarding our parish income and expenses for the fiscal year ended August 31, 2025.

Our Total Regular Receipts were \$1,290,464, compared to \$1,164,697 last year, an increase of 10.8%.

Our Total Ordinary Expenses were \$1,283,219, compared to \$1,290,603 last year, a 0.57% decrease.

Our Total Regular Receipts of \$1,290,464 exceeded our Total Ordinary Expenses of \$1,283,219 by \$7,245.

Our Total Revenue (consisting of \$1,290,464 of Regular Receipts, \$68,156 of Extraordinary Income and \$150,822 of Capital Campaign Revenue) was \$1,509,442. Our Total Expenses (consisting of \$1,283,219 of Ordinary Expenses, \$70,142 of Extraordinary Expenses and \$23,645 of Capital Expenses) was \$1,377,006. This resulted in excess income over expenses of \$132,436 which was added to our reserves. However, essentially all Campaign pledges have been paid in full and we, therefore, no longer will be receiving revenue from that source.

We invite you to read our Comparative Statement of Income & Expenses for Fiscal Years ending August 31, 2025 and 2024 for a breakdown of our regular receipts and other revenue and our ordinary and extraordinary expenses.

Based on the budget we submitted to the Archdiocese, we are projecting our Total Expenses will exceed our Regular Receipts by \$150,456 for the fiscal year ending August 31, 2026, notwithstanding budgeted increases in offertory collections. For the current fiscal year ending August 31, 2026, if our expenses exceed our revenue, it may be necessary to fund a portion of the deficit from one-time donations and bequests and the parish's reserves as has been done in the recent past unless there are increased annual collections.
