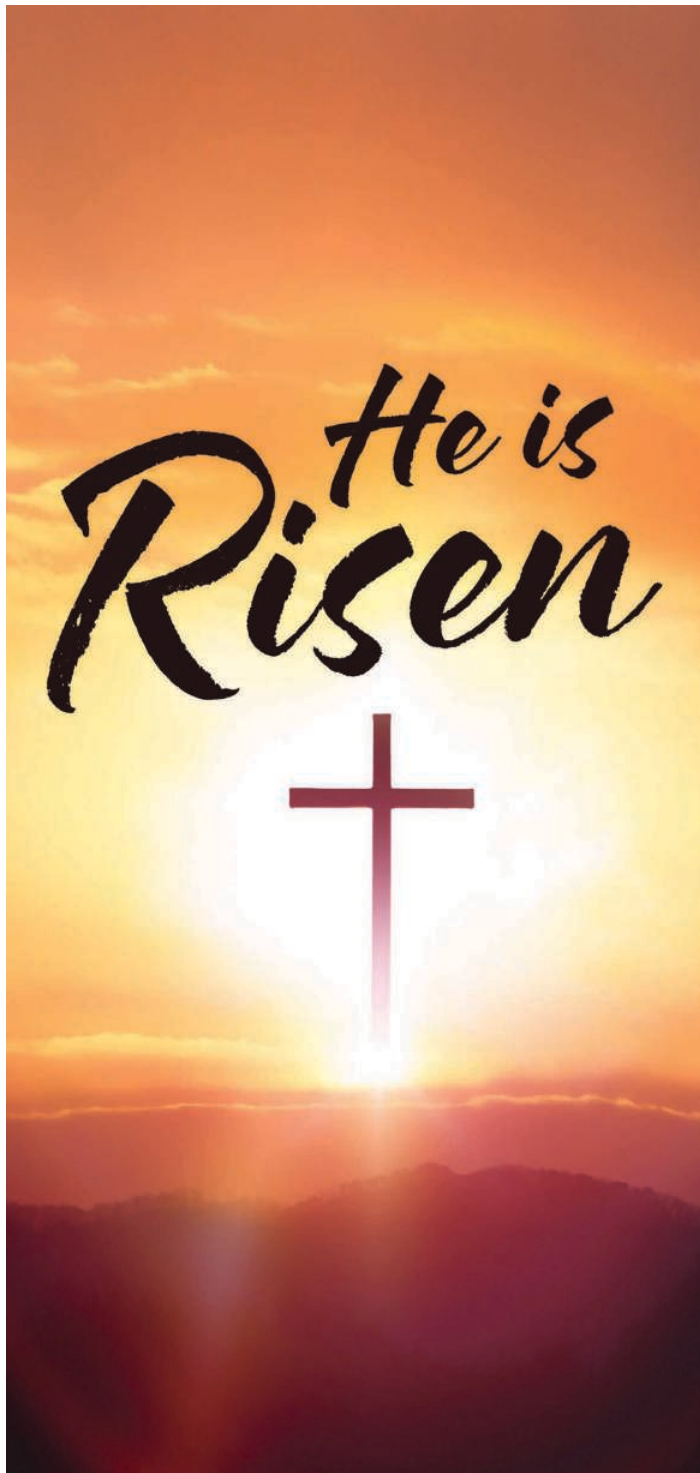

# Dear Padre

April 5, 2026

***I'm marrying my girlfriend! Although she grew up Catholic, she doesn't practice the faith. Is it still OK to marry her?***

Will you enter marriage with your fiancée because of a mutual love for each other? Do you both understand that this love will be strengthened by the sacramental grace of your matrimonial union, a grace you will receive because of baptism, not practice? Will you both try to create a loving family and, together as a family, try to be open each day to the grace of God already at work in your lives? Do you both realize that this grace calls you to create, in the name of Jesus, a witness to the truth of the gospel, which is even more powerful than the love you share?

If you hesitate to answer any of these questions with a wholehearted "yes," then consider exploring these questions together with your pastor or another person helping to prepare you for marriage. Perfect faith is not required for a good, sacramental marriage. Openness to faith is believing that the Lord who has brought you together is not yet finished with either of you. You both have more to learn, and, with God's grace, you will respond to his love. Jesus will work through both of you in ways that you may not even be able to imagine. In that spirit, marry her, build a life together, and know that God's plan for you will always be there. ●

### Religious Education

The Religious Education program of the Church of Saint Pius X offers instruction to students in elementary and middle school who are members of our parish. The program offers eight-years of study for students in the public schools. Each year, the program consists of two semesters of classroom instruction with each grade focusing on one aspect of the Christian faith. Our program reflects an integrated learning experience composed of Catechesis, prayer, sacramental preparation (First Reconciliation, First Holy Communion and Confirmation), traditional Catholic doctrine, Biblical studies, liturgy, community building, community service and other dimensions of vibrant Church life.

### Order of Christian Initiation for Adults (OCIA)

OCIA is the process by which persons who are considering conversion to the Roman Catholic faith participate in a period of reflection, prayer and instruction in the Catholic way of life. OCIA welcomes persons who seek to be baptized or desire to complete Sacraments. OCIA classes are held each Thursday (except during the summer) from October through March between 8:00 pm and 9:00 pm via Zoom. Catechumens are received into the Church.

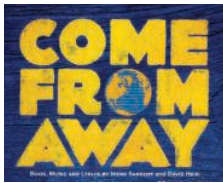

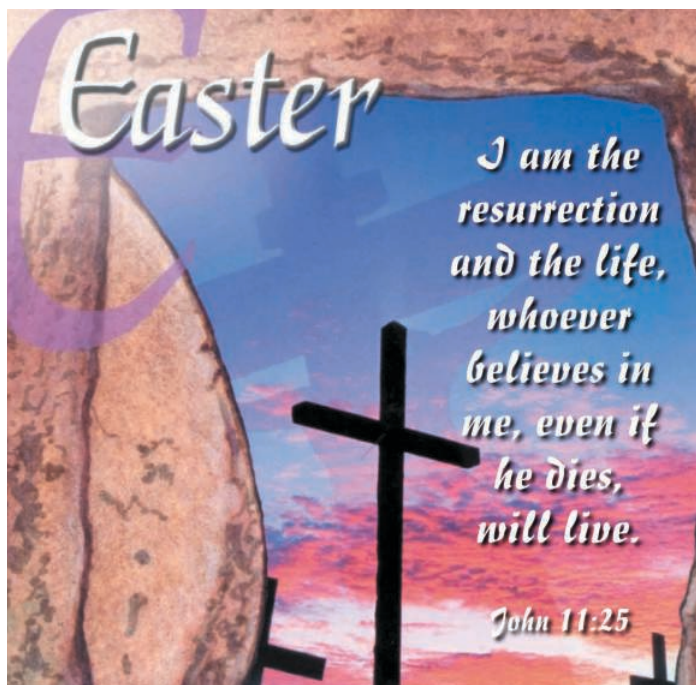
