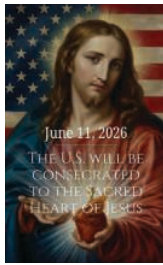

What is the significance of the Holy Eucharist in our lives as Christians?

The Mass should be understood as the celebration of our union—our communion—with Christ and his Church, which is the body of Christ. The Mass presumes participants have an existing personal relationship with Christ. We were united to Christ through baptism. We have received his Holy Spirit, empowering us to carry out Christ's threefold mission: the prophetic mission of announcing his message and denouncing sin; the priestly mission expressed in a life of prayer, self-sacrifice, and participation in the liturgy; and the kingly/servant mission expressed in service to God and neighbor.

For the Eucharist to be meaningful, we must first experience a personal encounter with Christ—one that leads to personal conversion and a decision to live as disciples in community. Indeed, the Eucharist both celebrates and deepens our communion with Christ. The Eucharist also deepens our communion with fellow believers. "The Eucharist's particular effectiveness in promoting communion is one of the reasons for the importance of Sunday Mass," wrote Pope St. John Paul II in *On the Eucharist in Its Relationship to the Church (Ecclesia de Eucharistia)*, 41. Without this loving, sharing community, the Mass becomes empty. Whenever we attend Mass and receive holy Communion, we should ask ourselves: *Are we really in communion with Jesus and the body of Christ, his Christian community?* If not, then we should seek this broader communion in our lives. ●

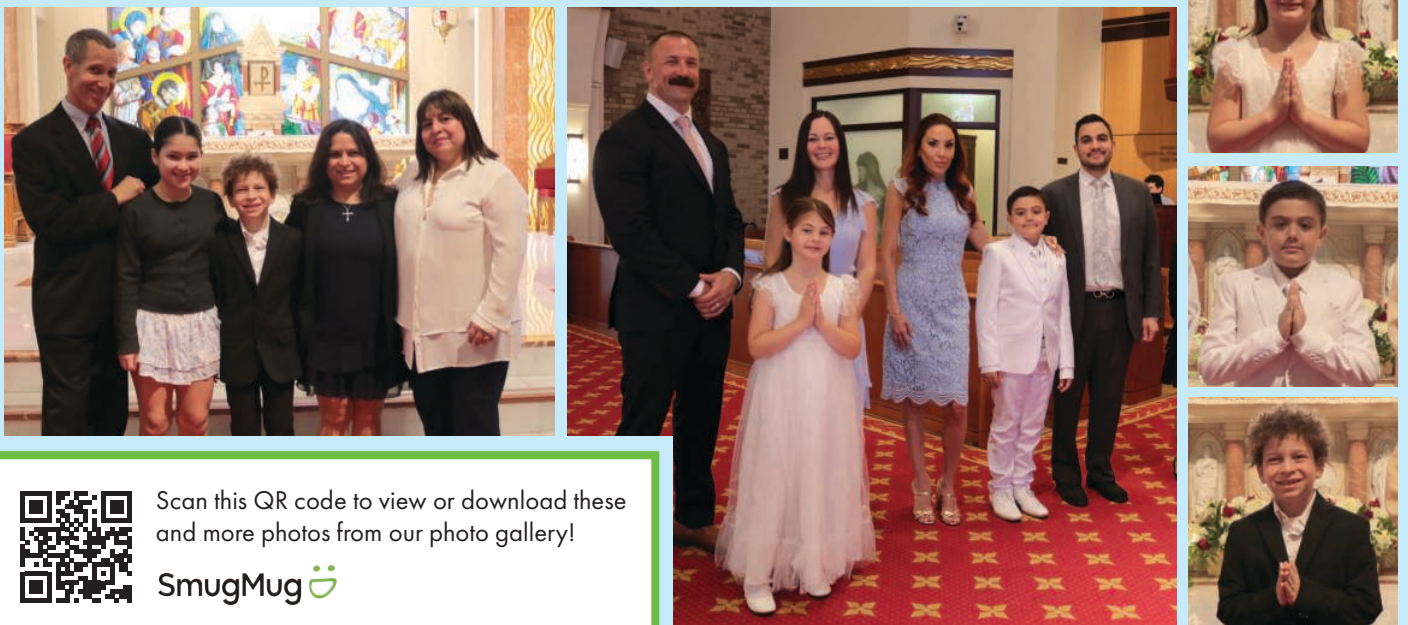

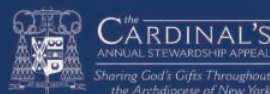
Summer Mass Schedule

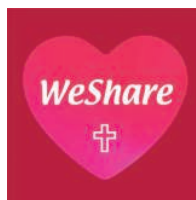

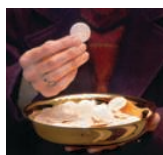

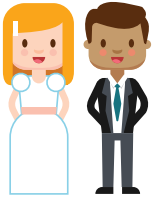
Parish Intention Book

Registration For New Students To Our Program

Registration for our Religious Education Program commences in the late Spring and must be completed by August 15 for the new school year. In order to register for our Program, the student's family must be registered members of the Church of St. Pius X.

Each new student must have a completed Church of St. Pius X Religious Education Program Registration Form and Baptismal Certificate on file with the Religious Education Office. In addition, each new student who is transferring from another program must provide a record of prior Religious Education Studies and, if he/she has made his/her First Communion, a First Communion Certificate to the Religious Education Office. The Registration Form may be printed, completed and mailed or delivered along with any applicable record/certificate and fees to the Church of St. Pius X Religious Education Office, 85 Palmer Ave., Scarsdale, NY 10583. Alternatively, you may register online, with applicable fees (plus a small processing fee via *WeShare*). If you register online, you will have the option to submit any applicable record/certificate online or mail/deliver them to the Religious Education Office.

Re-registration for families presently in our program

In order to re-register for another school year, each student must complete the Religious Education Registration Form.

Deadline to Register: August 15 prior to the beginning of the upcoming academic year. All forms and/or payments received after August 15 will incur a \$75 late fee.
